# **Cafcass Performance Report**

January 2018 Summary



## **Summary of Key Issues**

Year to date 2017/18 (Apr-2017 to Jan-2018), **11,756** new public law care applications have been received, this is -**3.2%** (-393 applications) on the same period last year. However compared to same period in 2015/16, it is +**13.9%** (+1,438 applications).


- Cafcass received a total of 35,437 new private law cases year to date 2017/18 (Apr-2017 to Jan-2018), this is +6.1% (+2,050 cases) on the same period last year. Compared to the same period in 2015/16, it is +15.3% (+4,693 cases).
- In the last <u>rolling 12 month period</u> (Feb 2017 Jan 2018) comparing to the same period in 2016/2017, total public law case demand (including non-care) is **+0.8%** and private law demand is **+6.3%**:
  - On average Cafcass has received 1,184 new public law (care) applications and 3,549 new private cases per month in the last 12 months (Feb 2017 – Jan 2018).
  - Over the last 12 months our overall stock of open cases are +11.8% with public law care stock +2.2% and private law cases +17.5% than February 2017.
- S31 Duration has remained at **31** weeks in Q3 17/18 for the fourth consecutive quarter. The previous full 2016/17 financial year had an average duration was 29 weeks (from 30 weeks in 2015/16).
- Overall performance remains strong with all KPIs in **Green** year to date (Apr-2017 to Jan-2018). Full KPI data can be viewed in the Appendix.
- As at January 2018 there was an full time equivalent of **1305.2** Social Work staff and a headcount of **128** Agency FCAs. This is **+2.4%** since Q2 17/18.
- Overall average caseloads have remained stable with the national average FCA active caseload at **19.6** cases (February 2018).
- At the end of Q3 2017-18, MoJ forecasted changes of +0.2% for <u>public law</u> and +3.7% for <u>private law</u> for 2017-18, these are calculated on historic data trend.

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


## **Public Law (Care)**



- Cafcass received a total of 11,756 new care applications between April 2017 to January 2018. The year to date demand is -3.2% (-393 applications) than the same period in 2016-17 and +13.9% (+1,438 applications) than the same period in 2015-16. The 1,168 new applications received in January 2018 is the highest monthly total for a January on record.
- The stock of open care cases (10,297) was +1.2% in January 2018 than January 2017. The overall open care cases stock has remained between 9,700 and 10,400 over the last 12 months.
- s31 applications completed in Quarter 3 2017-18 took on average 31 weeks to conclude, this has remained the same for the fourth consecutive quarter.


## **Private Law**




- Cafcass received 35,437 new private law cases between April 2017 and January 2018. This is +6.1% (+2,050 cases) than the same period in 2016-17 and +15.3% (+4,693 cases) than the same period in 2015-16. The 3,590 new cases received in January is the highest demand for a January since 2013.
- The stock of open private law cases (19,990) was +17.8% in January 2018 than January 2017. Overall open private stock law has remained between 16,900 and 20,000 cases over the last 12 months.
- Cafcass' involvement in Private Law in Quarter 3 2017/18 took an average of **17** weeks to conclude, this has remained the same from the previous quarter.


• Year to date 2017/18 all KPIs have exceeded target (April 2017-January 2018).

Children and Family Court Advisory and Support Service

- Following a number of months below 97% last financial year, KPI4 has maintained strong performance so far this financial year. The average number of weeks to file Section 7 reports has slightly increased from 9.6 weeks in 2016/17 (Apr-Jan) to 10.0 weeks during YTD 2017-18. Section 7 report demand is +12.2% (+1,786) in 2017/18 year to date compared to same period in the last financial year.
- KPI 2 performance is 1.0 working days to allocate a Children's Guardian, a decrease from 1.2 days for the same period in 2016/17.







## Private Law 2017/18 YTD













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



## Annex 1: Cafcass Office Map



- Forecasts based on <u>historical Cafcass data</u> predict new demand to change by +1.3% for Public Law and +5.5% for Private Law for the full 2017-18 financial year.
- At the end of Q3 2017-18, MoJ analysts forecasted that caseloads will change by +0.2% for public law and +3.7% for private law for 2017-18. These are reviewed and updated every quarter.
- MoJ analysts state that the wide range of possible drivers and variation by Local Authority, as well as the lack of quantified measures of the suggested drivers, means that a driver-based approach to forecasting public law volumes is currently not feasible.
- In the latest update (Jan 2018) MoJ analysts have forecast that caseloads will change by +1.7 for Public Law and +6.8% for Private Law for the 2018/19 financial year.



#### **Demand**
