
# **Cafcass Performance Report**

November 2017 Summary



## **Summary of Key Issues**


- Year to date 2017/18 (Apr-Oct), 8,343 public law care applications have been received, this is a decrease of 3.3% (283 applications) on the same period last year. However compared to same period in 2015/16, it is an increase of 16.9% (1,209 applications).
- Cafcass received a total of 25,438 private law cases year to date 2017/18 (Apr-Oct), this is an increase of 6.8% (1,612 cases) on the same period last year. Compared to the same period in 2015/16, the increase is 17.8% (3,844 cases)
- In the last rolling 12 month period (Nov 2016 Oct 2017) comparing to the same period in 2015/2016, care applications are <u>0.2% higher</u> and private law demand is <u>6.4% higher</u>:
  - On average Cafcass has received 1,193 new public law (care) applications and 3,515 new private cases per month in the last 12 months (Nov 2016 – Oct 2017).
  - Over the last 12 months our overall stock of open cases has risen by 4.2% with public law care stock 1.8%
     lower and private law cases 8.0% higher than October 2016.
- Quarter 2 2017-18 saw the average s31 Application duration reducing to **30 weeks** from 31 weeks in Quarter 1. The full 2016/17 financial year had an average duration was 29 weeks (down from 30 weeks in 2015/16).
- Overall performance remains strong with all KPIs in Green year to date 2017/18 (Apr-Oct). Full KPI data can be viewed in the Appendix.
- Despite the sustained rises in overall demand, the overall average active caseloads of our social work staff have fallen as additional frontline resources continues. As At November 2017 there was an full time equivalent of 1288.7 social work staff and a headcount of 158 Agency FCAs, a total increase of 12.6% since 31 March 2017.
- At the end of Q2 2017-18, MoJ forecasted for +2.8% for <u>public law</u> and +7.6% for <u>private law</u> for 2017-18, these are calculated on historic data trend.



- The stock of open care cases (9,967) was 1.8% lower in October 2017 than October 2016. The overall open care cases stock has remained between 9,700 and 10,400 over the last 12 months.
- s31 applications completed in Quarter 2 2017-18 took on average 30 weeks to conclude, this has reduced from 31 weeks since Quarter 1 2017/18.
- when compared to the same period in 2015/16.
  The stock of open private law cases (17,759) was 8.0% higher in October 2017 than October 2016 (1,308). Overall open private stock law has remained between 16,400 and 17,800 cases over the last 12 months.
- Cafcass' involvement in Private Law in Quarter 2 2017/18 took an average of 16 weeks to conclude, this has reduced from 17 weeks since Quarter 1 2016/17.





- Year to date 2017/18 all KPIs have exceeded target (April-October).
- Following a number of months below 97% last financial year, KPI4 has maintained strong performance so far this financial year. The average number of weeks to file Section 7 reports has slightly increased from 9.6 weeks in 2016/17 (Apr-Oct) to 10.0 weeks during YTD 2017-18. Section 7 report demand has increased in 2017/18 by 14.4% (1,451) compared to same period in the last financial year.
- KPI 2 performance is 1.0 working days to allocate a Children's Guardian, a decrease from 1.2 days for the same period in 2016/17.



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### Private Law 2017/18 YTD




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### Public Law care duration heat map (by DFJ Area)

### Care Application Duration (Q2 2017/18)


### Care Application Duration (Q1 2017/18)



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### **Demand Forecast**

#### **Demand Forecast**



- Forecasts based on <u>historical Cafcass data</u> show, a +4.3% for public law and +9.0% for Private Law predicted for the full 2017-18 financial year.
- At the end of Q2 2017-18, <u>MoJ forecasted</u> for +2.8% for public law and +7.6% for private law for 2017-18. These are reviewed and updated every quarter.
- MoJ analysts state that the wide range of possible drivers and variation by Local Authority, as well as the lack of quantified measures of the suggested drivers, means that a driver-based approach to forecasting public law volumes is currently not feasible.
- For this forecast MoJ analysts have made the assumption (in their view in the absence of any insight to suggest that the elevated levels of mid-2016 will occur again), that caseloads will increase from the current lower level, at a rate which reflects only the increase in the number of children in the population.
- Early 2017/18 data is in line with MoJ forecasts, although caution must be applied at this point in the year.
